

Zultys Received Interoperability Certification from SIP Print Labs

VoIP-provider [Zultys Inc.](#) has been certified by SIP Print ([News](#) - [Alert](#)) Labs' certification program. SIP Print is the maker of the SIP-based VoIP call recording platform for small to medium sized businesses.

In essence, SIP Print brings to the SMB, a capability that is not normally found, enabling organizations with the compliance and retention needs that they have.”

Zultys – as TMC reported earlier this year – is seeking to position itself for market share gains this year with a series of revisions, updates and new features to its [five core product families](#): the “Media Exchanges,” or “MX” platform that’s at the heart of its IP-PBX and UC system; IP phones; software and system management; connectivity; and Web conferencing.

Zultys has eight years of experience delivering thousands of SIP solutions deployed in 110 countries in 19 different languages. The company’s systems are reportedly designed to boost productivity, reduce complexity, ease administration, reduce costs and provide high availability.
