



LCD (Liquid Crystal Display)

- Headset Jack
- PROGRAM/EXIT: Used to enter and exit the personal programming mode.
- CLEAR: Used to erase some or all call logs, or clear digits or characters.
- **AUTO:** Used for Speed Dialing.
- **6 HOLD**^{*1}: Used to place a call on hold.
- **REDIAL:** Used to redial the last 10 dialed numbers.
- **BMUTE:** Used to mute the microphone/handset/headset during a conversation.
- MIC (Microphone): Used for hands-free conversations.

- SP-PHONE (Speakerphone)/ HEADSET¹: Used for performing hands-free operations. Also used to make or answer calls if a headset is connected.
- **MESSAGE**^{*1}: Used to access the Voice Mail feature^{*2} or to call back the party who left the message waiting indication. The indicator turns red in both cases.
- TRANSFER: Used to transfer a call to another party.
- Navigator Key*3: Used to adjust the volume and display contrast, select desired items, or view call logs.
- INFORMATION: Used to display your extension number, the status of the unit, and the network settings on the LCD display.
- **OK:** Used to select the items. Also used as end of dialing.
- *1 These 3 indicators simultaneously flash red when you cannot make or receive calls due to an error.
- ^{*2} Availability of this feature depends on your PBX. Consult your dealer.
- *3 Press up or down while the unit is idle to access the outgoing, incoming, and missing call logs.






During a Conversation



Connection

PC connection

- Use a straight CAT 5 (or higher) Ethernet cable (not included) that is 6.5 mm (1/4 in) in diameter or less.
- For further information on the connection to a PC, refer to the documentation provided for the PBX.

Switching Hub connection (for LAN port)

- Use a straight CAT 5 (or higher) Ethernet cable (not included) that is 6.5 mm (1/4 in) in diameter or less.
- It is recommended to connect to a switching hub that complies with the IEEE 802.3af Power-over-Ethernet (PoE) standard.
- If PoE is available, an AC adaptor is not needed.
- This unit complies with the PoE Class 1 standard.
- AC adaptor (not included)
- Use only a Panasonic KX-A239 (PQLV206) AC adaptor.
- The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device. Ensure that the AC outlet is located near the unit and is easily accessible.

CAUTION:

When selecting Ethernet cables

• Use flexible, high-quality, snagless (without strain relief) cables. Do not use cables with coating that may tear or crack when bent.

When connecting cables

- Do not connect the Ethernet cable connected to the PoE hub to the PC port of the KX-HGT100. Doing so may cause severe damage to the KX-HGT100.
- Ensure that the Ethernet cables and the AC adaptor cord are inserted in the grooves to prevent damage to the connectors.

When connecting a headset and AC adaptor

 Ensure that the headset cord and the AC adaptor cord are wound around the hook to prevent damage to the connectors.

When using a KX-HGT100, keep the following conditions in mind.

- If the unit does not operate properly, disconnect the unit from the AC outlet and the Ethernet cable and then connect again.
- If you are having problems making calls, disconnect the Ethernet cable and connect a known working KX-HGT100. If the known working KX-HGT100 operates properly, have the defective KX-HGT100 repaired by an authorized Panasonic factory service center. If the known working KX-HGT100 does not operate properly, check the PBX and the Ethernet cable.
- Wipe the unit with a soft cloth. Do not clean the unit with abrasive powders or with chemical agents such as benzene or thinner.
- Use only the correct Panasonic handset.
- Do not disassemble this unit. Dangerous electrical shock could result. The unit must only be disassembled and repaired by qualified service technicians.
- If damage to the unit exposes any internal parts, immediately disconnect the cable or cord. If the power is supplied from the network to the KX-HGT100 [Power-over-Ethernet], disconnect the Ethernet cable.
 Otherwise, disconnect the AC adaptor cord. Then return this unit to a service center.
- Never attempt to insert wires, pins, etc. into the vents or other holes of this unit.

- 2) When left unused for a long period of time, the optional AC adaptor should be unplugged from the AC outlet. If you are using Power-over-Ethernet, disconnect the Ethernet cable.

Installation Environment

1) Do not use this unit near water, for example, near a bathtub, washbowl or sink. Damp basements should also be avoided.

2) Keep the unit away from heating appliances and devices that generate electrical noise, such as fluorescent lamps, motors, and televisions.
